

Checklist

Bringing a new puppy into your home is an exciting time, and one of the first and most important tasks is potty training. Use this handy checklist to guide you through the process and set your puppy up for success:

Establish a Designated Potty Area

- Choose a specific area in your yard where you want your puppy to eliminate.
- Use consistent verbal cues, such as "go potty" or "do your business," to associate with the desired behavior.
- Consider using puppy pads or a specific indoor potty area if you prefer to train your puppy for indoor elimination.



Create a Consistent Routine


- Establish a regular feeding schedule to help regulate your puppy's bathroom habits.
- Take your puppy outside or to the designated potty area at consistent times throughout the day, including after meals, playtime, and naps.
- Stay consistent with the schedule, even on weekends or during busy periods.

Watch for Signs

- Learn to recognize your puppy's signs of needing to eliminate, such as sniffing the floor, circling, or whining.
- When you notice these signs, immediately take your puppy to the designated potty area.

Reward and Reinforce

- When your puppy eliminates in the designated area, praise and reward them with treats, verbal praise, and gentle petting.
- Use positive reinforcement to create a positive association between pottying in the right spot and receiving rewards.



- Keep a close eye on your puppy during potty training and limit their access to the rest of the house
- Use baby gates or crate training to prevent accidents in areas where you can't supervise your puppy.
- Take your puppy out on a long line so they can't walk away and get distracted by other things

Consistent Cleanup

 Accidents may happen during the potty training process. Clean up accidents promptly and thoroughly using an enzymatic cleaner https://pawtree.com/pawtree/product/2354 to remove the scent and discourage repeat accidents.

Patience and Persistence

- Potty training takes time and patience. Be consistent, and understand that accidents are a normal part of the learning process.
- Avoid punishment or scolding for accidents, as it may confuse or frighten your puppy.

Goal Setting

Remember, every puppy is unique, and potty training timelines may vary. Stay committed to the process, be consistent, and celebrate your puppy's progress along the way. With time and consistent effort, your Goldendoodle puppy will become a potty-trained superstar!
