

# *Puppy* *Socialization* Checklist



# *Hello!*

Ensuring your Goldendoodle puppy is well-socialized is key to nurturing a balanced and self-assured pet. This checklist will guide you in offering your puppy varied and positive experiences that foster their social growth.

Some may insist on a set number of exposures to each item on the list, such as 100. However, every puppy is unique. The goal of socialization isn't about ticking off boxes for a certain number of encounters, but rather about maximizing your puppy's exposure during their critical socialization period, which ends at 16 weeks.

Strive to introduce your puppy to as many experiences as possible, placing a strong focus on positive encounters and ensuring your puppy's comfort with each new exposure. If your puppy thrives in certain scenarios but struggles in others, consider dedicating more time to those areas that need improvement.

It's also important to consult your veterinarian about potential health risks for your puppy, such as parvovirus and distemper, especially while they are not fully vaccinated. The level of risk can vary considerably from one location to another, and your vet will be your best resource in navigating this. They can provide detailed advice tailored to your puppy's specific needs and your local environment.

Even in areas with high risk, there are methods to socialize your puppy safely. One such technique could be carrying your puppy in a sling or a specially designed puppy backpack. This approach allows your puppy to experience a wide range of stimuli and interactions without direct contact with the ground or other dogs, reducing the risk of contracting diseases.

## Exposure to Various Environments

- Gently handle their feet and nails to prepare them for future grooming sessions.



## Exposure to Different Sounds

- Introduce your puppy to common household sounds like vacuum cleaners, doorbells, or kitchen appliances.
- Gradually expose them to louder or unfamiliar sounds like traffic, thunder, or fireworks.



## Positive Experiences with Various Objects

- Provide your puppy with a variety of safe toys, chews, and interactive puzzle games.
- Introduce novel objects such as umbrellas, bicycles, or skateboards in a positive and controlled manner.





## Training and Basic Commands

- Teach your puppy basic obedience commands like sit, stay, come, and leash walking.
